

HEALTH CAREER PATHWAY CHART FOR PRE-HEALTH STUDENTS

The information below is based on the most updated research done by Pre-Health Dreamers (PHD). Please note that this information is subject to change. We recommend that you use this document as a starting point to begin your journey in researching professional programs. This document was created to help support individuals who have Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA), Temporary Protective Status (TPS), or who do not have a Social Security Number (SSN).

Application Process	Applicants must submit an online application through AMCAS; for certain institutes in Texas, TMDSAS will be used instead. Applicants who do not hold a valid visa should select "None" on the drop-down list for the Citizenship question on the AMCAS or TMDSAS. The option "DACA" is also available on the AMCAS's citizenship question.	 Nursing programs may provide the option to apply through: A. Direct campus application or B. Clinical Requirements	Most schools require at least 2 years of clinical clerkship rotations during 3 rd and 4 th year of medical school. Clerkships vary from 4- 8 weeks rotations and include internal medicine, general surgery, OB-GYN, pediatrics, family medicine, psychiatry, neurology, etc.	Clinical preceptorships may be integrated with classroom education. Students receive hands-on experience in a variety of healthcare settings and specialties. Preceptors and clinical sites are specific to each program.	Most dental schools have their own dental clinics for student training. Clinical rotations will usually occur during the last two years of the dental programs. Clinical rotations typically have no extensive traveling requirements.	 1,500 internship hours are required to graduate. Students apply for licensure as 1st year students.
